In this dissertation, I show how two antithetical online gaming communities—the farright /r/KotakuInAction and the leftist /r/GamerGhazi—utilize the Reddit platform's democratic voting interface to distort or manipulate debates about feminist and critical race issues in American culture. Drawing from intersectionality and masculinity studies, I argue Reddit's design, algorithm, and business model suppress feminist and anti-racist activism, thereby providing fertile nesting ground for far-right extremism. Given Reddit's unfriendliness to feminism and anti-racist activism, together with its ubiquity as a daily news source for millions of Americans, I assert that Reddit deserves more scholarly attention than it has received.
